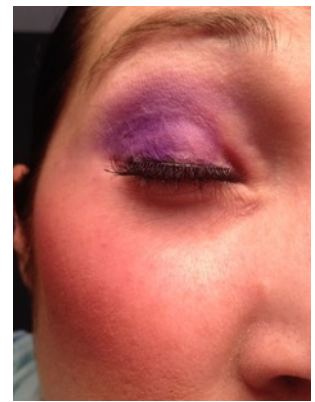
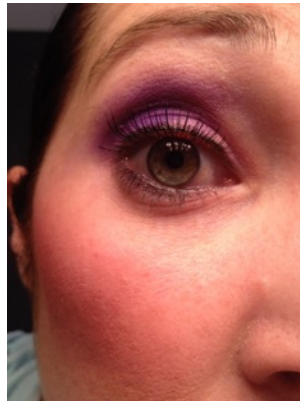
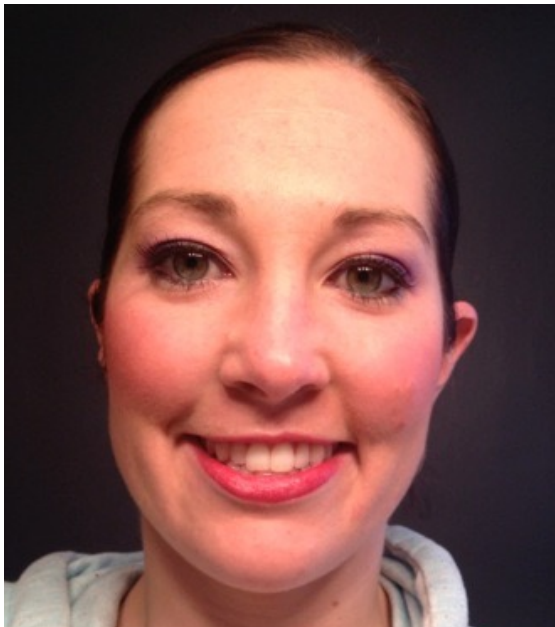


Helpful Tips for Performances

As a representative of Joy of Dance, it is expected that you stay professional and keep a positive attitude both in person and on social media in regards to any event we attend.

You can accomplish this by:

- Wishing dancers from other studios good luck before they perform and congratulate them afterwards
- Thanking other dancers when congratulated by them
- Seeking out others dancers from pieces you loved and letting them know how you enjoyed it
- If you receive any negative comments or have any concerns, find Miss Lindsey before responding to it
- **Remember - Stay positive, Be polite and Have fun!**

Helpful Items to bring - not everyone needs all of these items, so grab a buddy and share some things highlighter, pen, nail polish remover, band aids, ice packs, hairspray, bobby pins, safety pins, sewing kit, scissors, tylenol, hair elastics(the color of your hair), hair nets

Stage Makeup:

Stage make up goes on a shade darker than normal everyday make up so it can be seen under the bright lights. For foundation, you want to pick a color that is a shade darker than your skin tone. Miss Alex is using purple eyeshadow, but you should use neutral tones(tans, browns and grays), dark brown or black should be used for eyeliner and mascara, light pink or red for blush, pink lipstick for younger dancers and red for older dancers. Dancers will also need fake eyelashes
